¹**DePaul** – Students who complete Calc I, II and Stats prior to transfer will not be required to complete additional math at DePaul.

²**DePaul** – Refer to transfer guide for Philosophical Inquiry (PI), and Religious Dimensions (RD) requirements. Take BUS 132 to fulfill one of two PI courses (may take additional PI course from PHI 121, 125, 128, 129, 221 or HUM 127 or take upon transfer). Take PHI 123 or 126 to fulfill RD, (note: only PHI 126 is currently listed on guide but both will fulfill).

³**DePaul** – BUS 270 is no longer offered at CLC, but fulfills DePaul's' global business perspective requirement if it was taken while the course was active at CLC.

⁴**EIU** – Choose between MTH 224 or PHI 122 or HUM 127.

⁵**ISU** - Take BOTH ECO 221 and 222 at CLC OR upon transfer you can take take ISU's ECO 105 (a combination of micro- & macroeconomics). BUS 221 is recommended.

⁶**NEIU** - The NEIU Business transfer guide was last updated since 2018. Please contact an NEIU transfer advisor to verify information.

⁷**NEIU** - Must complete Foundation courses with a C or better and earn a Foundation Course GPA of 2.5; must complete at least 60 credit hours of course work with a 2.0 GPA overall.

⁸**SIUC** - This is for the Bachelor in Business Administration degree completion program (online or campus). 60 credit hours completed by time of enrollment.

⁹**UIUC** – Choose one: MTH 145 or 224 or MTH 142 or 222 (when choosing a 2nd choice major, that major may have different math requirements so choose a math course that fulfills both your choices)

¹⁰**UIUC** – Three yrs in high school or the 2nd semester in college of a single foreign language for admission (thru 3rd semester in college for graduation). Recommend to complete before transfer.

¹¹**UIC** – This is for the Bachelor in Business Administration (BBA) degree completion program (online or campus). 44 hours required to apply and 60 credit hours completed by time of enrollment.

¹²**UIC** – CMM 121 will satisfy UIC COMM 100 and is manually added by a business advisor when admitted.

¹³**UIC** – For Math take 4 credit hours of Finite Math, Calc or Business Calculus. It is highly recommended to take additional Math, Calculus, or Stats (to satisfy electives requirements). See their catalog.

¹⁴**UIC** – See Transferology for options to fulfill Analyzing the Natural World, Exploring World Cultures, Understanding the Past, Understanding Creative Arts requirements, Understanding Individual and Society. ECO 221 or 222 may be used to fulfill Understanding U.S. Society.

¹⁵**UWP** – Students who earn an A.A. or A.S, are considered to have completed the UWP general education requirements. Students must still satisfy the ethnic diversity and foreign language requirements.

¹⁶**UWP** – UWP requires ENG 120 or 126 or 266 for their fundamental prep course requirement. If ENG 122 is taken, a student will also need to choose one of the 3 ENG courses listed.

¹⁷**UWP** - The Ethnic Diversity Requirement for UWP graduation, may be taken at CLC. Choose one: EDU 224, ENG 246, ENG 264, HST 240, HST 241, THE 123, PDS 123 (no longer offered).

¹⁸**WIU** - CIT 120 is not required for core however it meets prerequisite for a required course at WIU (CS 302); WIU also has a proficiency exam to meet the CS 302 prerequisite.

¹⁹**WIU** - ACC Majors take BUS 222.

²⁰**WIU** - There is a foreign language/global issues graduation requirement (see the Western Illinois General Reference Guide for details).
