¹**Elmhurst University** – This transfer option is suitable for students earning an AA/AS: there is a minimum of 10 courses required for transfer. See Elmhurst Nursing Transfer Guide for specific requirements. Elmhurst also offers an RN-BSN completion degree: admission requirements include possessing an RN license, a 2.75 GPA, and a 2.75 GPA in all science courses. Note: CHM 125 is not required for RN-BSN students.

²**ISU** - The Mennonite College of Nursing only considers Fall admission. They offer: RN to BSN program; Traditional Pre-licensure BSN program; Accelerated Pre-licensure BSN Program. This transfer option is suitable for students earning an AA/AS degree or the IAI General Education Core Curriculum with grades of C or better in each course for a total of 56 hours.

³**ISU** – AMALI Global Studies: choose from ANT 121, 221; ART 261; ENG 246, 247; GEG 122, 123, 223; HST 126, 127, 128, 245, 246; HUM 128, 129, 141; JPN 121, 122; LAT 121; PHI 126, 221; PSC 222

⁴**Lakeview** - This transfer option is suitable for students earning an AA/AS: requires a minimum of 60 credit hours of preliminary coursework to transfer. Lakeview offers several other BSN Tracks including accelerated, part-time and RN-BSN completion degrees. Please see Lakeview website for details.

⁵**NIU** – This transfer option is suitable for students earning an AA/AS; a minimum of 24 transfer credits required to transfer. NIU offers an RN-BSN completion degree: refer to NIU's course catalog.

⁶**Olivet** – This accelerated transfer option is suitable for students earning an AA/ AS /AAS degree or minimum of 82 credit hours accepted as transfer.

⁷**Rockford** – This transfer option is suitable for students earning an AA/AS: Students may apply in either the spring or fall semester based on completion of a minimum of 60 credit hours at the conclusion of the semester preceding entrance to the Nursing program. See Rockford's website for additional information.

⁸**Saint Xavier** - This transfer option is suitable for students working toward completing the IAI GECC. St. Xavier recommends that students transfer after completing 2-3 semesters of recommended courses. St. Xavier also offers RN-BSN program and LPN-BSN Program.

⁹**Saint Xavier** – The SXU Chemistry requirement (CHEM 109: Survey of General, Organic & Bio-chemistry) has no equivalent at CLC, however CHM 121 is recommended as a prerequisite to their course.

¹⁰**Saint Xavier** – Any SOC/ANT General Education Course is required.

¹¹**UIC** – Please see Transferology.com and run a Nursing program with equivalencies for specific course choices to fulfill one course in each of the following areas: Exploring World Cultures, Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts, (additional electives may be required).

¹²**UIC RN-BSN** – If pursuing UIC's Online RN-BSN program, in addition to completing an RN, there are additional courses that can be taken at CLC to fulfill UIC Baccalaureate requirements before transferring. Refer to [UIC's Transfer Guide](#) for course options when choosing your additional required courses. It is strongly recommended that you choose ANT 221 for the multicultural requirement, as it fulfills UIC's world culture requirement. You will also need Understanding the Past, Understanding the Creative Arts.

¹³**UIC RN-BSN** – May take CMM 121, 123 or 128

¹⁴**UWP** - The University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee (UWM) College of Nursing together with the University of Wisconsin-Parkside (UWP) offers a Bachelor of Science in Nursing at the UWP campus. Students who are admitted to this program will be required to meet UWM's general education/graduation requirements, since the degree will be granted by UWM. Therefore, this program does not follow the agreement CLC has with UWP regarding completion of the AA/AS degrees. You are encouraged to make an appointment early on to meet with the UWP Nursing Advisor. See [UWP Getting Started Guide for Nursing](#) for more information and contact info.
